The Disability Resources Centre assists students with disabilities to achieve their academic goals and participate fully in university life. It offers a confidential support service for students studying with a temporary or permanent disability, injury illness and/or health condition.

The principal role of Disabilities Service is to coordinate the services required by students with disabilities so that they can access and participate in the learning environment.

Students whose disability necessitates the organisation of specialised services are responsible for making early contact with the staff of the Disabilities Service.

Uni-Key Program is a free program operated by Student Equity Services to assist students to settle into the university environment and meet new people.
